



Each election cycle, Pro-Choice Washington works to elect reproductive freedom champions who will protect and expand access to abortion and the full range of reproductive options in Washington state.

We prioritize endorsing statewide and legislative candidates in competitive districts with the potential to make the biggest impact on abortion access through:

- Investing to build capacity to win in the most competitive swing districts where reproductive freedom champions face tough races against anti-abortion opponents.
- Organizing to build power in districts where constituents face the biggest barriers, like long travel times to abortion providers, health systems with restrictive policies, and an increase in anti-abortion and white nationalist activity.
- Building a bold, intersectional, and inclusive movement for reproductive freedom by centering candidates of color and LGBTQIA+ who have lived experience with barriers to health care.

Over the last two election cycles, over 50% of Pro-Choice Washington's direct campaign contributions supported BIPOC and LGBTQIA+ candidates.

The remaining 50% was invested in competitive races in districts with the highest barriers to abortion care.

We endorse candidates on a rolling basis, from the primary election to the general election.

Our endorsement process invites candidates from the districts where Pro-Choice Washington can make the biggest impact to complete a questionnaire that evaluates their position on important issues to Pro-Choice Washington's community.
